WORKSHOP LOGISTICS

Directions to the workshop location

The workshop will be held at the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Bozeman Fish Technology Center at 4050 Bridger Canyon Road, in Bozeman, MT (see Map on Page 2).

If you are heading east or west bound on I-90 take EXIT 306. Turn north off of EXIT 306 onto N 7th Ave. Continue to follow N 7th Ave. for approximately 0.1 miles. Turn RIGHT onto W GRIFFIN DR. and drive for 0.7 miles. Turn LEFT onto BRIDGER DR / MT-86 and drive 2.8 miles toward the "M" hill. Turn right just after the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service sign to enter the center.

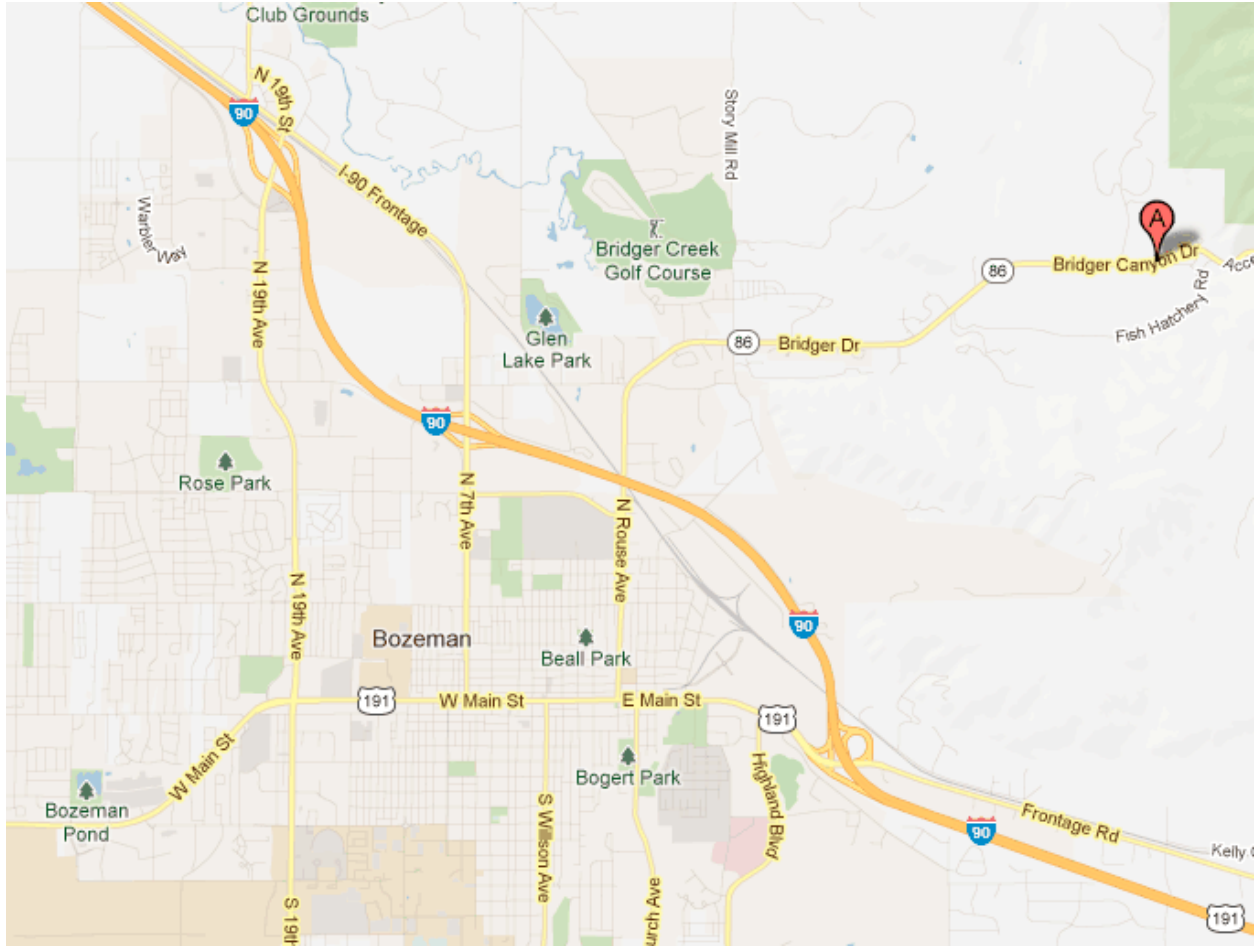
If you are coming from downtown Bozeman, head east on MAIN STREET. Turn LEFT onto N. ROUSE AVE / MT-86 and drive 4.0 miles toward the "M" hill (the road will become BRIDGER DR / MT-86 after 1.4 miles). Turn right just after the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service sign to enter the center.

Meals

We will provide breakfast and lunch on both days of the workshop. There will be a "social hour" with drinks and light snacks in the afternoon of June 4th, but you will be on your own for dinner. There are several restaurants in downtown Bozeman [located along Main Street, starting a few blocks east of 7th Avenue and running a few blocks east of Rouse Avenue]. There are also restaurants located along 7th and 19th Avenues.

Lodging

There are a number of hotels to choose from in Bozeman. The City Center Inn (<http://city-center-inn.magnusonhotels.com/>) is a basic hotel (~\$89.00/night) that is located in downtown Bozeman, within walking distance of restaurants and shops. There are a number of chain hotels (Holiday Inn, Hilton Garden Inn, Best Western Grantree Inn, C'Mon Inn) located near the I-90 highway entrances at 19th Avenue and 7th Avenue, within driving distance of downtown Bozeman. Most of the hotels should have government rates available, although there are no special deals associated with the workshop.



The Bozeman Fish Technology Center is located at the red “A” symbol. Downtown Bozeman is located along Main Street, starting a few blocks east of 7th Avenue and running a few blocks east of Rouse Avenue.
